

STP – TEMPORARILY PRESENT FOREIGNER – CODE

Healthcare for foreigners without a residence permit is provided by issuing an individual regional STP (Temporarily Present Foreigner) code, which identifies the beneficiary for all eligible services.

The healthcare system provides urgent, essential, and ongoing outpatient and hospital care for illness and injury, in public and accredited medical centres, and enables access to preventive medicine and to individual and community health protection programs.

It is valid throughout the country for six months and can be renewed if the beneficiary does not yet have a residence permit.

In the absence of an identity document, it is sufficient to register the personal details provided by the interested party- Declaration of indigence- Illegal residence status in the country (These documents can be filled in at the Public Relations Office)

<p>AND SERVICES</p>		<p>the person's life or health</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Essential care: treatments related to pathological conditions that are not immediately or short-term dangerous, but which might occasion greater damage to health or pose a life-threatening risk over time - Continuing care: treatments aimed at ensuring that the individual receives the entire therapeutic and rehabilitation cycle to guarantee the eventual resolution of the illness - Pregnancy and maternity care - Child health care - Prevention: access to preventive medicine, prophylaxis, and individual and community health safeguard and protection programs - Visits, tests, and medications: it is possible to obtain prescriptions for clinical-instrumental tests and specialist visits using the regional prescription form, and request distributable medications
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
